

## **American Oxford Sheep Association 2022 Spring Newsletter**

### **National Show and Sale**

The 2022 National Oxford Show and Sale will be moving to Joliet, IL. Joliet Junior College will be hosting us at the Weitendorf Agriculture Education Center (17840 Laraway Road, Joliet, IL 60433). While this facility is part of the junior college it is not located on the main campus. The show for the sale will be on Friday, June 10, and the sale on Saturday, June 11.

Once again, we plan to offer an on-line component to the sale and possibly even for the show. ### **Oxford Ewe Lamb Futurity**

In 2021, we had a record number of ewe lambs nominated at the various live and on-line sales for the Oxford Ewe Lamb Futurity program (65 head). Which was awesome. We also had a record number of those ewe lambs actually purchased by Juniors and entered into the program for the summer and fall show season (20 head). The national winner of the 2021 program was Jarod Neumeister of IN with WWSF 21-19. District winners were: District 2 – Jillian Bingen, WI with D.Hall 222; District 3 – Lydia Pool, IL with WWSF 21-52; District 4 – Paisley Sprowl, OH with Edgebrook 0494; District 5 – Jarod Neumeister, IN with WWSF 21-19; District 6 – Chad Hoover, PA with D.Hall 215. Remember, both live sales and on-line sales can have ewe lambs (fall and spring born) nominated by breeders for this program. And 100% of the nomination fees are paid-out to the participating juniors. This is a great way to promote your breeding program and to reward our Juniors and encourage them to add top quality breeding stock to their flocks.

### **2022 All-American Junior Sheep Show (AAJSS)**

The 28<sup>th</sup> Annual AAJSS when be going to the Big E facility in West Springfield, MA; June 30 – July 3, 2022. This is the third time in the shows history to be at the place where the annual 3-on-3 basketball tourney is played at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. If you have never been to the great facility, you owe it to your family to join us in New England this summer. If you have been there before, you know the excitement around both the Big E fairgrounds and the basketball hall of fame. Another feature of this year's AAJSS is that at the Big E facility a week later, the Northeast Youth Sheep Show will be held (July 8-10). Sheep can remain in the facility between the 2 shows and all youth (not just those from the Northeast) are welcome and encouraged to stay and make New England your family 2022 "Showcation". Arrangements are being made for some special activities for the stay-over families between the shows. There will be 26 breeds participating in the AAJSS this year. Judges for the AAJSS will be Dustin Cruit of IL, Troy Longenecker of PA and Nick Miniter of CT. Again, we will have a Lamb Camp for the young family members, the 3-on-3 basketball tourney, sheep skill-a-thon, sheep judging contest, team and individual showmanship contests, wool show, and promotional contests. New to the show this year will be the Supreme Champion Ram and Ewe drive on Sunday afternoon. Entries close May 25, 2022; with a higher entry fee for any late entries submitted after the deadline date and post entries at the show.
